

This three-voice fugue for guitar, commissioned by my colleague Xu Zhengnan from the Royal Danish Academy of Music's Guitar Department, represents a confluence of traditional and innovative musical techniques. While the stylistic elements and contrapuntal methodologies bear semblance to Johann Sebastian Bach's conventional fugue compositions, I have integrated a contemporary interpretation of contrapuntal techniques and the structural intricacies of the fugue form. It is imperative that performers approach this piece not with the sole intention of emulating Bach's style, but with an awareness of its unique interpretative demands. The score is embellished with an array of musical expressions and dynamic notations that surpass those typical of the Baroque period. These additions should be viewed as subjective recommendations from the composer's perspective and not as prescriptive performance directives. Indeed, it is anticipated that seasoned musicians will bring their own insightful interpretations to this composition, thereby enriching it with enhanced dynamism and interpretative possibilities.

From a performance and musicological standpoint, the work poses significant challenges in terms of execution and sight-reading. The completion of this piece was facilitated by collaboration with a fellow guitarist, who provided practical input on the feasibility of each section, despite the intricate and demanding nature of the fingering required. As such, this version of the score deliberately omits specific fingering instructions, allowing performers the liberty to devise their own fingering schemes that best suit their interpretative style and technical comfort. Additionally, the notes within parentheses are optional; they may be played to enhance the musical effect, but can also be omitted to maintain fluidity in performance.
